School Touch Information

Welcome to Kapiti Junior Touch's 2022/2023 season, Kapiti's largest summer sport.

New 2020 rules enable more game time for all.

U7-U8 Mixed teams are 5 aside, with no on-field ratio and age friendly rule changes. U10 Mixed teams are 5 aside, with no on-field ratio, they play on half fields and age friendly rule changes. U12-U14 grades are now mixed and boys teams (mixed teams are equal gender ratio's)

<u>Fees</u>

Fees for **14 games** are **\$40.00 for the first child in the family, then \$30.00 for each subsequent child per family.** If we have enough for a **Year 8 team, the fees will be \$25.00 for the half season.** This year we have reduced fees due to COVID last season and missing out on half a season of game time. Can we please have one registration form for each child. **Registrations and payments need to be made via Kindo by Friday 16th September 2022.**

Please note that there is a **no pay no play** policy (please note that all prior years fees also need to have been paid in full as well, these are already on Kindo). Any queries about this please contact either Kate in the Office or Viv Conroy our principal. We are asking for payments to be paid via Kindo, however if you have any difficulty with this or want to pay the subs off please be in contact with Kate in the Office.

<u>Teams</u>

Each team has limited numbers, with a minimum of 4 girls per team (for the U12 and U14 grades), with a recommended team maximum of 10. Teams will be streamed where there is more than one team represented in a grade. This is to ensure all players are given the best opportunity to enjoy the game. We can have an all-boys team in the higher grades, so we have included this on the registration form.

Season Dates

The first leg of the season starts on Tuesday 25th October 2022, stopping for Christmas break on Thursday 15th December 2022 which makes 8 weeks.

Leg two of our season starts on Tuesday 14th February 2023, until Thursday 23rd March 2023 which makes 6 weeks.

All games are played at Mazengarb Reserve, Scaife Drive, Paraparaumu.

Our school will hold its own prize giving at school, the date is to be advised.

<u>Uniform</u>

All players must wear our school touch top (which will be issued at the beginning of term 4) and either our bottle green P.E. shorts or black shorts as their uniforms during play. Boots with metal sprigs, open footwear (i.e. jandals) or **bare feet aren't allowed** on touch fields, referees will send offending players off the field. **Please note that no uniform, no game play.**

Each child will be given a school touch top with a number assigned to it. This must be returned at the end of the season in good condition. If this top is lost or returned in an unsatisfactory condition, you will be charged the full price to replace it i.e. \$30.00 each.

Game Days

Tuesday's U7/U8, games will be at 5.00pm or 5.40pm Wednesday's U12 and U14s, games will be at 4.50pm, 5.30pm, 6.10pm or 6.50pm Thursday's U10s, games will be at 5.30pm, 6.10pm or 6.50pm (Times may vary but this will be finalized closer to the start of the season)

The weekly draw will be on the KJT website every Monday - <u>www.sporty.co.nz/kapitijuniortouch</u> (Coaches will email or text the time of games to you once your child has been allocated a team) **NOTE**: Grade eligibility is determined by player's age as of January 1st, 2023. **IE**: If your child is born in the following years they will play in the following grades:

- 2017/2016 U7s,
- 2015 U8s,
- 2014/2013 U10s,
- 2012/2011 U12s,
- 2010/2009 U14s,
- 2008 Year 8

<u>Rules</u>

Module Rules were modified in 2020 to align with the new Touch NZ Junior Policy, which has been designed to enhance player participation and enjoyment at every age. A simplified version of touch rules is available at www.sporty.co.nz/kapitijuniortouch

Under 7/8s Changes

All Under 7 and Under 8 teams;

- have open ratio teams, which means that the team can be made up of any number of boys and girls.
- there will be 5 on the field with a maximum of 10 to a team.
- coaches take the field to referee to assist game flow and manage players.
- play across a half field.
- all errors count as a touch and they have 6 touches before handover.
- change of possession will start with a plant ball, including penalties.
- must wait until the dummy half passes the ball to start play before advancing to make a touch.
- substitutions can tap the player on the field when they wish to substitute the player.
- players can be awarded touchdowns if they run over the touchdown line but must be reminded of the grounding process.
- touches are performed with the connect of 1 hand with next to zero force.
- are to be played with a close enough is good enough policy. Enjoyment, growth, and success are the key focus.
- scores are not recorded by KJT.

Under 10s Changes

All Under 10 teams;

- will play on a reduced field. Which is across a half field with the inclusion of the touchdown zone.
- now have 5 players on the field with a maximum of 10 to a team.
- now always needs to have at least 1 female on the field.
- will play with standard Touch Rules.
- will have referees assigned
- coaches must remain on the sideline to manage players.
- touches are performed with the connect of 1 hand with next to zero force.
- all touchdowns scored as 1 point.
- scores are recorded by KJT and teams will be graded.

Under 12/14s Changes

All Under 12/14 teams;

- will play on a standard field.
- still have 6 players on the field with a maximum of 12 to a team.
- Mixed grades will play with 3 males and 3 females on the field.
- can have a boy only grade, so standard rules will apply.
- will play with standard Touch Rules.
- will have referees assigned.
- coaches must remain on the sideline to manage players.
- touches are performed with the connect of 1 hand OR 2 hands with next to zero force.
- all touchdowns scored as 1 point.
- scores are recorded by KJT and teams will be graded.

Cancellations

In the event that we need to cancel play due to weather, Kapiti Junior Touch will update their website, their Facebook page and inform me as soon as they are able and I will inform all coaches as well as the school office.

Coaches and Helpers

We require coaches and helpers for every team we enter, no previous experience is needed. Please don't let not being able to run a practice at school stop you from stepping up. Remember, if we do not have coaches, our players will be unable to play.

Touch has one of the highest participation numbers of any summer sport in Kapiti and we hope this is because it nurtures some of the **positive values of sport – fair play, participation? And fun.** Please consider coaching a team, it's not hard, and is a rewarding experience.

- Never put undue pressure on your child to perform
- Try to understand the rules of the game
- Promote competition as an important aspect of participation in sport while ensuring that your child accepts winning and losing gracefully.
